How to Join First Evangelical Lutheran Church

For those who have visited First Church and are interested in becoming a member, we plan to receive members several times a year: The Baptism of Our Lord, Palm Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, Reformation Sunday, and through baptism at the Vigil of Easter. For those new to Lutheranism or to the Christian faith, a class is offered prior to reception. All members are invited to attend this class as a refresher course. For those who wish to join by way of transfer, an orientation class is offered the Sunday prior to the reception. Lunch is always provided.

Holy Trinity Sunday

Holy Trinity Sunday is a festival always celebrated the Sunday after Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. The Church year gives us Pentecost to begin what may be called the Church Semester of the year and to remind us that the Holy Spirit is actively involved in the life of the Church. Holy Trinity Sunday is a time to reflect on who is to be at the center of our life together: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

How to Become Involved at First Church

Those wishing to become more involved at First Church can speak with Pastor McClanahan or Pastor Peterman about a growing number of opportunities. The young adults group *Selah* offers fellowship and service activities once a month. Every third Friday at lunch the Julius Knigge Class meets for seniors. A new group for parents with young children is in formation.

Sunday Church School Class

Starting today, a new class will explore the non-Lectionary gospel texts. As you may know, our gospel texts are appointed on a 3-year cycle called the Lectionary. This moves us through the birth, teachings, miracles, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ, the core of our life together as a Christian community. The lectionary does leave a number of interesting gospel stories uncovered from the pulpit, however. This class will give us the chance to explore those less familiar texts in great detail. The class will begin in June, and is in the Parish Hall at 10:00 Sunday mornings. The class will begin with Matthew and move through the gospels in order.

Coffee and a light breakfast are provided.

Narthex Chapel Restored

As you walk into the narthex, if you look to the right, you will find a lovely room there, another example of the many blessings of this building. Originally intended to be a small chapel, the room was for many years re-purposed as a storage room, and still is used as the room in which brides wait before processing down the aisle.

While there is still work to do, an altar and pews are in place, and storage shelves and tables have been removed. The chapel will serve as a place of daily Morning Prayer for the community and as a place of meditative prayer for our members anytime during the week.

A Basket for Food Donations to Christian Community Service Center is placed outside the narthex after our worship service and inside the narthex before the service.
